PROVINCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 00-68

**GRANTING INCENTIVE OF ONE MONTH BASIC PAY SALARY
TO ALL OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE PROVINCIAL
GOVERNMENT OF BENGUET**

“WHEREAS, the present economic crises is a nationwide experience, thus employees of the Province of Benguet likewise need all the assistance they can get to weather the present economic storm brought about by the jack up prices of gasoline and crude oil;

WHEREAS, the grant of One Month Basic Pay Salary will ease the financial burden of employees and officials particularly during this time of economic difficulty, encourages extraordinary efforts and achievements in the performance and delivery of public service and boost the sagging morale of government employees reeling from the effects of the economic crises;

WHEREAS, Section 468, (viii) of Republic Act No. 7160 otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991 provides that;

“Section 468. Powers, Duties, Functions and Compensation. - (a)
The Sangguniang Panlalawigan, as the legislative body of the province,
shall...



(viii) Determine the positions and the salaries, wages, allowances and other emoluments and benefits of officials and employees paid wholly or mainly from provincial funds...”

NOW THEREFORE, on motion duly seconded, be it

ENACTED BY THE SANGGUNIANG PANLALAWIGAN IN SESSION
ASSEMBLED THE FOLLOWING:

SECTION 1. Incentive of One Month Basic Pay Salary herein granted shall be payable to officials and employees who have rendered at least a total of 4 months of service and still in the service, whether appointive, or elective, permanent or casual, temporary, contractual whose employment is in the nature of a regular personnel, as follows:

Length of Service	Percentage
4 months and above	100%
Less than 4 months but more than 3 months	75%
Less than 3 months but more than 2 months	50%
Less than 2 months but more than 1 month	25%

SECTION 2. The amount of P9,339,423.00 is hereby appropriated for the purpose to be taken from the savings from operations of all offices from previous years and the current year under the General Fund.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.

December 14, 2000

Respectfully returned to the Honorable Members of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, through Hon. Robert M. Tinda-an, Vice Governor and Presiding Officer, the herein Resolution No. 00-68, which was received on December 13, 2000, with my VETO thereon for the following reasons:

1. For the same reasons in disallowing the Inflationary Adjustment Allowance paid last year, the Commission on Audit will certainly disallow this incentive pay unless there is sufficient legal basis which should have been first secured;
2. The opinion of the Secretary of the Department of Interior and Local Government or the Secretary of Department of Budget and Management should have been obtained before the enactment of the ordinance;
3. The ordinance does not specify the sources of the savings that will be utilized for the incentive pay; and
4. According to the computation of the Provincial Budget Office, the amount required is P8,573,893.00, not the amount of P9,339,423.00 mentioned in the ordinance.
