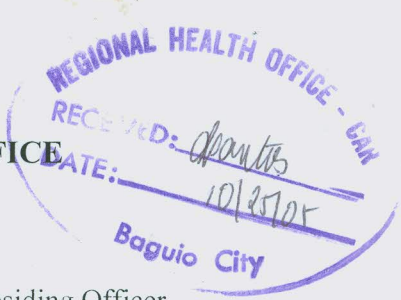

PROVINCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 05-104

AN ORDINANCE PROMULGATING THE LOGISTICS MANAGEMENT OF COMMODITY SELF RELIANCE PLUS IN BENGUET MANDATING ITS IMPLEMENTATION AND SUSTAINABILITY AND PROVIDING FUNDS FOR THE PURPOSE

WHEREAS, the LEAD for health project under the Department of Health is a 3-year health governance project designed to assist LGU's nationwide;

WHEREAS, there is a gradual reduction and eventual phase out of international donor-supplied contraceptives;

WHEREAS, there is a need to pass an ordinance to promulgate the logistics management of commodity self reliance plus in Benguet mandating its implementation and sustainability and providing funds for the purpose;

On motion duly seconded,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE SANGGUNIANG PANLALAWIGAN OF BENGUET, IN SESSION ASSEMBLED, THAT:

ARTICLE I – TITLE AND GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 1. **Title.** This ordinance shall be known as the Logistics Management Policy on Commodity Self Reliance Plus in Benguet.

SECTION 2. **Declaration of Principles and Policies of the Local Government of Benguet.**

- 2.1. The constitution mandates that health services should be provided to the people;
- 2.2. The local government of Benguet recognizes its role in the implementation of priority health programs devolved to the province;
- 2.3. The local government of Benguet realizes that there is a gradual reduction of contraceptive supplies donated by USAid through its Family Planning Services, one of the priority health programs;
- 2.4. The local government of Benguet is committed to support the implementation and sustainability of Commodity Self Reliance Plus.

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ARTICLE II – IMPLEMENTING MECHANISMS

SECTION 3. ***Strengthening the Provincial Health Office.*** The technical capability of the Provincial Health Office shall be strengthened through the creation of the PHO Technical Working Group on LEAD for Health Project.

The PHO Technical Working Group on LEAD for Health Project shall have the following functions and responsibilities:

- 3.1. Formulate specific plans and programs as well as devise strategies and systems for the effective implementation of the Logistics Management on Commodity Self Reliance Plus, adopt measures to ensure the efficient and effective delivery of basic health care services, and provide adequate facilities;
- 3.2. Monitor implementation of health programs;
- 3.3. Conduct capability building and education activities for health workers and service providers; and
- 3.4. Conduct evaluation of health programs.

ARTICLE III – IMPLEMENTATIONS

SECTION 4. ***Implementation of Logistic Management Policy Guidelines.*** The following are the policy guidelines for all LGUs in managing donated and locally provided contraceptives:

- 4.1. Donated and locally procured contraceptives will be distributed equitably and be made available to all current and potential users during the phase-out period;
- 4.2. The provincial TWG will review and recommend revision to the provision of these guidelines by the first quarter;
- 4.3. Donated contraceptives will be allocated proportionately based on consumption of the municipalities; and
- 4.4. To address shortfall, the province will adopt the 70:30 cost sharing scheme of which 70% of the gap is shouldered by the municipality and the 30% by the province.

ARTICLE IV – FUNDING AND APPROPRIATION

SECTION 5. ***Funding and Appropriation.*** For attainment of the objectives of this ordinance, the local government of Benguet shall appropriate the amount of Seven Hundred Seventy Eight Thousand One Hundred Twenty One Pesos and 40/100 (P778,121.40) for one year for the 13 municipalities of Benguet.

ARTICLE V

SECTION 6. ***Separability Clause.*** If any section or provision of this ordinance would be declared unconstitutional or invalid, other sections or provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 7. ***Repealing Clause.*** All ordinances and local issuances or rules and regulations inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 8. ***Effectivity Clause.*** This ordinance shall take effect upon approval thereof and after publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the Province of Benguet.
